DATE OF DEATH	1 November 1914 (aged 32)
BATTLE	The search by the 4 th Cruiser Squadron for the German Far East Squadron in the Pacific
REGIMENT	HMS Good Hope, Royal Navy
DEATH	HMS Good Hope attacked and suffered catastrophic damage in the Pacific and sank with all hands on board
FAMILY DETAILS	Gerald, the youngest child of Stephen, a labourer, and Elizabeth Grey of Broad Oak, Odiham, was born on 25th April 1882^{xii}. He had one older brother and four older sisters^{xiii}. Gerald attended London Road Board School from 25th March 1889 until 19th March 1896, when he 'went to work'^{xiv}. In 1901 he was employed as a baker^{xv} and living at home with his parents at Broad Oak. In 1901 he joined the militia service and in 1904 he joined the Royal Navy, but by 1911 he was back home in Broad Oak working as a coal carman^{xvi}.
